

Medicaid for the Aged, Blind and Disabled (ABD Medicaid)

To qualify for ABD Medicaid, applicants must be:

- age 65 or over or
- considered legally blind or
- an individual with a disability (as classified by the Social Security Admin.)

Applicants must also be a U.S. citizen or meet Medicaid citizen requirements:

- be an Ohio resident
- have or get a social security number
- meet certain financial requirements



When applying for ABD Medicaid, proof of income, resources, age or disability, citizenship, and other health insurance is required. Applicants can ask an authorized representative to apply for them. If applicants meet all of the requirements but are over the income limits then they will be eligible for Spenddown Medicaid. If eligible for Spenddown, the consumer is required to submit proof of medical expenses, unpaid past medical bills, or the consumer has the option to pay the Spenddown amount directly to the Job & Family Services. All eligible Medicaid recipients are entitled to in-home care through the Core (this program is designed to meet the basic home care needs of Medicaid consumers who need up to 14 hours of nursing and/or daily living services per week).



A face to face interview with a case manager at the Morrow County Job & Family Services is also necessary. Interviews are done on a walk-in basis on Mon., Tues., Wed., Thurs., from 8:00 to 12:00 p.m. or by appointment when required.
